

WELCOME TO CANTERBURY

The historic city of Canterbury is appropriately the birthplace of Merefield's Electronics Ltd. It is a city eager to cling to age-old values of decency and determination with a desire to grow and face the future with confidence and an entrepreneurial spirit.

Canterbury and Merefield's belong to each other. They share the same ideals and hopes, with Merefield's by far the junior partner.

The city, in South East England, has welcomed pilgrims for thousands of years and is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Its skyline is dominated by the majestic Cathedral, the Mother Church of the world-wide Anglican Communion. It is the Archbishop of Canterbury who crowns the Kings and Queens of England.

Over the years, thousands of pilgrims have flocked to the city to visit the shrine of Thomas Becket, who was murdered in the Cathedral.

The sense of history can be found in almost every street and Merefield's is proud to play its part in preserving the past for present and future generations.

The company has bought, and lovingly restored, some of the city's leading buildings. After the Cathedral, one of the most photographed by tourists is Sir John Boys' House, with its famous leaning front door.

The 17th Century house was described by the great author Charles Dickens in his novel David Copperfield. Merefield's work restoring the building won the company a prestigious Canterbury Society Preservation Award.

The company has also bought, and renovated, two other major buildings, now housing language schools and one, like Merefield's own headquarters, is situated in Canterbury's thriving Chinese quarter.

Merefield's also has its own special connection with James Bond. The company bought the Duck Inn in a village on the outskirts of Canterbury where it was reputed the James Bond author, Ian Fleming, wrote some of the Bond stories.

The building, which can trace its roots back to 1623, has been carefully restored by Merefield's and attracts visitors from throughout the world.

Merefield's is very much part of the local community and its directors head a committee which raises thousands of pounds each year for local charities and good causes.

Its annual Kasra Golf Day and dinner and dance at the palatial Broome Park, Lord Kitchener's former home, has become one of the most popular events on the social and sporting scene, attracting golfers and guests from throughout Britain and abroad.

Geographically, Canterbury is on the doorstep of Europe, with the port of Dover and Channel Tunnel less than half-an-hour drive away. London is just 60 miles up the line and major airports are in near reach.


